An intimate journey between Italy and Japan in search of memory: It intertwines the voice of Dacia Maraini with archival images, dissolving drawings, and encounters that illuminate a destiny woven between two cultures. Director Izumi Chiarioluce, a silent and empathetic witness, gathers the threads of a personal and collective tale. Dacia's words become a bridge between distant worlds, between past and present. A new and profound portrait, paced by the time of memory and the vibrant rhythm of curiosity. A tribute to the gentle strength of a woman who has made writing, photography, and dialogue her true home.

Director's notes

Our shared love for art and books—and my own Italian-Japanese roots—created fertile ground for a beautiful dialogue with Dacia Maraini. I realized how profoundly Japanese she is in many ways: in her gentle and measured gestures, and above all in her sense of 'We'. Dacia devotes much of her time to others—promoting books and culture, and maintaining a heartfelt dialogue with students. I was deeply moved by the curiosity and questions of students about Dacia's extraordinary childhood in Japan. For this reason, I wanted to explore and share how this journey between Italy and Japan has shaped Dacia and her work. Through Dacia's evocative voice, her memories become ours too—enriched by extraordinary photos from her personal archive. All this is 'Dacia, Vita Mia – Japanese Dialogues,' my first feature-length film.
